
This report provides monthly institutional (Victims Unit, Ministry of Health, National Historical Memory Center and Mayor/Governor's Offices) and Victims Law achievements.

R1. Improved GOC Strategic Management for Victims Law

Inauguration of Cartagena's Victims Attention Point

- Supported the renovations and equipment provision of the Victims' Attention Point in Cartagena in order to provide dignified attention and reparation services for victims, while the ongoing design and construction process to build a Regional Attention Center for Victims in Bolívar advances
- The Victims Unit's regional offices are focal points for victims at the local level and strengthen the regional provision of attention and reparation services

Improving institutional offer for victims

- Strengthened the Victims Unit's Inter-institutional Management Directorate through various actions:
- * Supporting the design of the strategy "We are all system" to coordinate government institutions, assessing victims' investment in the regions
- * Establishing a co-financing mechanism between the Victims Unit and local authorities to fund projects
- * Disseminating the victims participation protocol
- * Creating a bank project to finance initiatives designed by victims representatives
- Defining procedures to submit information when required by the Constitutional Court
- These multifaceted actions have strengthened the Victims Unit's coordination role in SNARIV and advanced the integrated implementation of the Victims Law at the local and national levels

Victims' public policy reviewed in Caquetá

- Workshop held with 16 regional ombudspersons, the regional inspector general's team and VISP to analyze the situation of victims' public policies in Caquetá
- Participants revised the regional budget and execution of resources for victims, discussed victims' participation in Caquetá and established a monitoring and evaluation strategy for the local implementation of the Victims Law
- Workshop identified the need to increase budgetary allocation for victims and strengthen reparation policies

Chocó updates Local Action Plan (PAT) for victims with funding guaranteed by Governor's office

 Supported the session to update Chocó's Local Action Plan (PAT), taking into account needs and priorities for victims' reparations

VISP Monthly Highlights 18 - October 2014

- Governor Efrén Palacios confirmed his promise to designate nearly USD 5 million from the General Royalties System and USD 900,000 from the department's budget to finance the PAT in 2015
- Following institutional coordination and advances by the Victims Unit's Regional Office, the Regional Inspector General's Office, the Governor's Office and victims, the PAT's completion is expected by November 20
- R2. Improved GOC Rehabilitation Services for the Wellbeing of Citizens

Health secretaries have capacity to implement the Comprehensive Health Program for Victims (PAPSIVI)

- Strengthened the Ministry of Health and Departmental Health Secretaries' capacity to provide initial training processes to PAPSIVI Interdisciplinary Teams
- A total of 800 civil servants from 10 departments have been trained
- Health Secretaries' ability to directly implement training processes with PAPSIVI teams ensures long-term sustainability

Regional workshops on disability policies with diversity mainstreaming

- Five regional workshops were held (in Medellin, Cali with the participation of Nariño and Cauca, Santa Marta and two in Bogotá) on implementing national disability policies and developing guidelines and strategies for comprehensive rehabilitation for victims with disabilities
- 270 participants, including victims with disabilities from victims participation roundtables, Regional Disability Committee delegates, and civil servants from the Victims Unit and Action against Mines from 32 departments, attended the workshops
- A final document will be published for SNARIV's Rehabilitation Sub-Committee to replicate the exercise at the national level

R3. Transitional Justice Processes Advanced

Historical memory workshop with civil servants from the National Assistance and Reparation System (SNARIV) and victims' municipal liaisons from Tumaco, Pasto and Samaniego

 Provided training on the institutional responsibilities of SNARIV institutions and victims' municipal liaisons to disseminate and appropriate regional and local historical memory processes and initiatives

Return and Relocation Protocol presentation event

- Supported a technical workshop with 155 municipal victims' liaisons on the Return and Relocation Protocol; participating municipalities were selected based on the state of their return or relocation plans and their participation in the Victims Unit's Central – Local strategy
- Presented the final document of the Return and Relocation Protocol, which was approved by Resolution 0329 of 2014
- Revised the return or relocation plans designed in order to determine their viability with the support of a "dvnamic" project (provecto dinamizador) for 2015

R4. Select GOC Institutions and Systems Accommodate the Specific Needs of Ethnic Groups and Women

Intercultural dialogue with ethnic authorities and local authorities in Montería

- Supported a meeting between ethnic and local authorities to include diversity mainstreaming in victims attention and reparation services
- Presented VISP supported methodologies and products developed by the Victims Unit's Ethnic Affairs Directorate to the Victims Unit's Regional Office in Córdoba and local authorities
- Collected information on ethnic communities' participation in the implementation of diversity mainstreaming in Córdoba


